Alhamdulillahi Robil Al Ameen. I give thanks to Almighty Allah (SWT) for His Infinite Grace and Mercy over us and for granting us His special Grace to pilot the affairs of our great citadel - Al- Hikmah University, Ilorin - the first Islamic faith-based unversity in Nigeria.

The compilation of 2020/2021 Annual Report of the University becomes imperative for some obvious reasons. First, it is a mandatory exercise of every serious institution or organisation which seeks to attain greatness by recording its past activities, reflecting on them and charting a better fiuture. Second, I discovered that, to date, the University has no record of such report. Third, since the current administration has taken up the onerous task of blazing the trail in several aspects of the University life, including the establishment of International School, commencement of inaugural lectures, initiative on strategic plan, debut of University journal, among others, this publication would be included among such feats.

During the period covered by this report - 2020/2021 academic session, all the relevant units of the University engaged in a number of activities and recorded substantial achievements. At the Management level, the smooth academic and administrative running of the University was maintained. In addition, greater efforts were made to support human capital development through in-house workshops and trainings. Both academic and non-academic staff were sponsored on conferences and trainings. The University Management also successfully had National Universities Commission accreditation within the period. Alhamdulillahi, the University secured full accreditation in all the 23 academic programmes presented for accreditation between March and April, 2021 (except for only one with interim status) while all the 11 programmes which were accredited in January, 2022, secured full accrediation.

At the faculty and departmental levels, apart from the teaching and research activities, deans and heads of departments were challenged to commence regular seminars. Reports from faculties anddepartments show that many of them have commenced these academic activities. The University Management has indicated wilingness to collaborate with sister universities on staff exchange and trainings, and in particular, training on research grant winning skills. This has commenced in earnest during the 2020/2021 acacemic session with workshops on pedagogy

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(facilitated by Professors R. A. Lawal and F. A. O. Olasehinde Williams of University of Ilorin) as well as virtual workshop on grant writing skill (delivered by Professor Ayodele S. Jegede of University of Ibadan).

The various centres were also behives of activities throughout the period under review. The robust engagement between the centres and the University Management on the one hand and between them and students, University community and the public, on the other, contributed immensely to the national and national visibility of the University.

Finally, as the University progresses towards delivery of its core mandate to the Nigerian public and global community, all of us who are stakeholders in this great task must redouble our efforts and resolve to ensure the attainment of the noble vision of our University - to serve as forerunner in the provision of quality University education of international standard.

May Almighty Allah (SWT) help us all. Ameen.

Introduction

The Academic Planning Unit is one of the units under the Vice Chancellor's Office. The Unit is headed by Dr S L Nurudeen, who is a high ranking academic staff of the University. He is assisted by some relevant professionals and other support staff. The Director is directly responsible to the Vice Chancellor for the day-to-day activities of the Unit. The Unit occupies Rooms 18 and 19 of the former Postgraduate Wing of the University. Room 18 is for the Director while Room19 serves as the General Office. The Unit superintends over the academic activities of the University, some of which are highlighted below:

The Unit Coordinates all efforts towards National Universities Commission (NUC) and other Council's accreditation of academic programmes in the University.

The Academic Planning Unit serves as a link between the University and the National Universities Commission (NUC), which is the regulatory body of all Universities in the country. It serves as the quality control office of the University, co ordinates and streamlines all academic related issues of the University, in line with the guidelines of the NUC, as well as monitors the growth and development of new academic programmes.

In the performance of its statutory functions of teaching, research and community development as well as public service, the Unit serves as data bank for the University in respect of staff, students and other statistics required in guiding Management in the decision making process on academic matters in the University.

The University currently has 50 fully accredited undergraduate programmes spread across 7 faculties, namely: Humanities and Social Sciences, Natural and Applied Sciences, Management Sciences, and the Faculty of Education. Others are Faculty of Law, Faculty of Agricultural Science and the Faculty of Health Sciences. Presently, our Postgraduate School has over 50 programmes ranging from Postgraduate Diploma and Masters to Ph.D. across all the faculties, except the new Faculty of Agriculture.

ACTIVITIES EXECUTED AND OUTCOMES:

1. NUC and Council's Accreditation Exercises

The Academic Planning Unit, as part of its statutory functions took charge of the preparation of the accreditation and re-accreditation of twenty-three (23) of our undergraduate programmes which ought to have taken place in 2020 academic session but was postponed due to COVID-19 pandemic and ASUU strike.

To conduct the pending November/December, 2020 accreditation between March and April, 2021, twenty-One (21) accreditation teams comprising of eighty (80) panelists drawn from various universities across the nation and NUC were deployed for the exercise. The 23 programmes presented are:

The result of the NUC accreditation exercise was favourable as twenty-two (22) of the programmes presented earned full accreditation status, while, only B.Sc. Information had Interim accreditation status.

2. Medical Laboratory Science Council of Nigeria (MLSCN) Accreditation

The Academic Planning Unit after the NUC accreditation, immediately, swung into action to ensure no stone was left unturned for the professional accreditation of Medical Laboratory Science programme. The 4-man team for the accreditation exercise was hosted by the University. The professional accreditation exercise took place between 21st and 23rd, September, 2021. The result of the exercise was also a success story.

3. Existing Academic–Related Committees Linked with the Unit

i. Academic Programme Planning Committee (APPC)

The APPC is a Senate Committee headed by the Deputy Vice Chancellor, Prof. G. O. Akashoro. The Committee is saddled with the responsibilities of looking into issues relating to the development and review of curricula of programmes and other related issues. The Committee is however, expected to report back to Senate for final approval. The Academic Planning Unit serves as the secretariat for the activities of Committee.

The Committee was very active during the year under review, as members worked tirelessly to see to the establishment of some new programmes. The following programmes were processed for Senate ratification and approval and all of these programmes had since commenced.

- i. M.Ed. Chemistry
- ii. M.Ed. Mathematics
- iii. M.Ed. Business Education
- iv. Ph.D. Science Education
- v. Certificate in Enterprise Development,
- vi. Sixteen (16) undergraduate Sandwich Degree Programmes for Continuing Education
- vii. Four postgraduate Sandwich Degree Programmes for Continuing Education
- viii. Professional Certificate in Islamic Estate Distribution and Certificate in Da'wah and Imamship Practice
- ix. Ph.D., M.A., PGD, and Certificate programmes in Peace and Security Studies.

ii. The Strategic Planning Committee (SPC)

The SPC is chaired by the Dean of Postgraduate School, Prof. A.O.Y. Raji. The DAP and the Principal Planning Officer and some other members constitute members of this Committee. In fulfillment of part of its mandate, the SPC left no stone unturned in ensuring that the 5-year working plan is put in place to serve as blueprint for the present Vice Chancellor. To achieve this important task, the Committee after several meetings embarked on a retreat to complete the work. This is also a landmark achievement for the University.

4. Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) Agreements

As part of efforts to meet the need of some of our Health Sciences programmes, the Unit facilitated the signing of MoU with the University of Ilorin Teaching Hospital (UITH) and Lubcon Company Limited. The MoU is to enable their laboratories serve as external laboratories for Medical Laboratory Science and Petroleum Chemistry Students, respectively, as required by their various counsels.

5. Nigeria Bureau of Statistics Data Form

The Unit received a survey questionnaire form from this Bureau requesting for data on staff, students, incomes and other activities of the University. The form was completed and submitted on behalf of the University.

6. NUC State of University Education in Nigeria

As part of following-up on the publication *The State of University Education in Nigeria* with the 2019 edition, the NUC requested a maximum of 7-page report together with the statistics component to be completed and sent via online. The report and other statistical forms were completed and submitted within the stipulated time on behalf of the University.

7. NUC Digest

The Director during the 2020/2021 academic session, out of his tight schedule created time during the day and sometimes at night to attend online meetings and trainings organised, by the National Universities Commission on modalities for completing the assignment inspite of the tight schedules.

8. The Examination Time-Table and Space Allocation Committee (ETSAC)

This Committee is chaired by the Director of Academic Planning while the Deputy Registrar (Academic) is the Secretary. The Committee meets regularly to look into time-tables for all lectures and examinations within the University.

9. Other Activities Undertaken by the Unit are:

- The Director served as the Chairman of the 2021 Convocation Ceremonials Committee
- The Unit played a major role in the preparations of the University annual Budget.
- The Unit, in collaboration with the Academic Affair Unit, is also responsible for the preparation of the University's Annual Calender.
- The Unit works with heads of departments to produce students' handbook on a regular basis.

Challenges

- i. The Unit is under staffed compared to what is applicable in other Universities. We, therefore, wish to request that the manpower needs of the Unit be enhanced with the engagement of holders of relevant degrees with ICT knowledge in order to meet the NUC Quality Assurance Standards considering the volume of work the Unit.
- ii. Inadequate training for the staff of the Unit. The Unit is a technical Unit hence, the need for regular training to enhance performances.
- iii. Lack of access to University's data for proper planning and to meet NUC statistical requests at all times.

BRIEF ON THE FACULTY

The Faculty in the year under review performed all administrative duties in line with the University guidelines by engaging in teaching, research and development of the host community. Academic and non-academic staff were forthcoming in their obligations to the Faculty and the University at large.

The Faculty engaged in farming activities. It planted crops and raised broiler chicken for sale to the university community covering all the three campuses, Igbaja inclusive. Within this period, the Faculty expanded its land cultivation and started dry season farming. More space meant for agricultural purposes was cleared to further expand areas required to meet standards available in many faculties of agriculture around the country. In the same vain, a staff on sabbatical joined the services of the Faculty, servicing the Agronomy Department and assisting in nurturing the system with his wealth of knowledge. Worthy to note is that the Faculty encountered several challenges on its farms in terms of low quality personnel, insufficient personnel, herdsmen intrusions and other human constraints leading to reduction in harvest of farm produce.

BRIEF ON THE DEPARTMENT

The idea of establishing the Department was mooted in 2011. The Department finally took off in 2011/2012 academic session when the University successfully admitted students into various programmes of the Department. The pioneer students of the Department comprisesed four (4) students in Arabic Education, Two students in Islamic Studies Education and one student each in Economics and Political Science Education programmes.

The Department currently houses the following programmes:

- a. Arabic Language Education
- b. Economics Education
- c. English Language Education
- d. Islamic Studies Education
- e. Political Science Education
- f. Social Studies Education

In 2017/2018 academic session, Islamic Studies Education and Arabic Language Education programmes commenced Master degree programmes leading to award of M.Ed. degree in the programmes. Also Ph.D. in both Islamic Studies and Education and Arabic Language Education programmes were introduced in 2020/2021 academic session.

Currently, the department has six programmes at the undergraduate level and two programmes at postgraduate level.

The acting head relates cordially and officially with the academic staff, the non-teaching staff, and the students for smooth running of the department.



ACTIVITIES OF THE DEPARTMENT IN THE YEAR

a. Undergraduate Programmes

Allocation of students to supervisors for project and dissertation writing is a core activity that comes up in the Department. The students in 400 Level are to write a project for them to graduate, as well as the postgraduate students. Registration of students for the courses they offer comes up at the beginning of first semester under the guidance of each level adviser and Acting Head of Department. Other activities carried out in the department include: orientation for students on various academic issues and maintenance of discipline, supervision of examinations and marking student scripts, computation, uploading and printing of students' examination results by lecturers and supervision of students' projects by lecturers in the Department.

b. Postgraduate Programmes

A postgraduate programme was approved during resource verification that came up in 2017/2018. As such, M.Ed in Islamic Studies Education, Arabic Language Education and Ph.D. in both programmes are currently being run.

c. Other Programmes

Top-Up Degree/ HND Conversion as Weekend Degree Programmes

This cuts across every department in the University. The departmental lecturers participate in the programme. A departmental coordinator was appointed for the programme. Another programme established in the University in which the department participates is the Sandwich Degree programme and Continuing Education degree programme. The department participates in the teaching of all approved courses; which comes up during long vacation from July- October every year.

d. Other Activities

Other activities in the department include holding of departmental meetings to discuss crucial matters that border on the progress of the Department. Occasional briefing with students and orientation on discipline in the department and in the University as a whole were done during the year.

BRIEF ON THE DEPARTMENT

The Department of Community Health was established in 2018 with the undergraduate degree programmes in Public Health. The first set, consisting of five (5) students are to graduate in the upcoming convocation of the 2020/2021 academic session. The Department currently has 48 students in 100 Level, 45 in 200 Level, and 15 students in the 300 Level.

In November, 2019 the NUC approved additional Postgraduate Diploma in Public Health after a resource verification exercise. A Public Health Museum and Laboratory was established to support teaching and research and to help students develop skills in a variety of common field related situations. The Department of Community Health was one of the Departments approved after verification by the National University Commission (NUC) prior to the 2018/2019 session. The Department received full accreditation in June, 2021.

The Department started with the Public Health programme, with a student population of 5 and an academic staff strength of 3. Since then, both the students and staff population have grown appreciably. Currently, the Department has a student population of one hundred and fourteen (114), and it graduated its first set of students in the convocation ceremonies of 4th December, 2021.

The staff strength is still very weak, with only a tenure staff and 8 part-time and adjunct staff. The Department also does not have a secretary and a clerical officer.

The training of highly skilled public health officer is a critical element in the attainment of sustainable development goals and implementation of universal health coverage. In 2018, the University launched the Department of Public Health Science with a vision to produce capable hands to serve humanity as scholars and practitioners in the field of Public Health in line with international standards.

The Department has been conducting academic programme as approved by the NUC and guided by the curriculum which has been carefully designed and structured to reflect new developments at local and global levels, to enable the students to be practitioners capable of shaping a better and safer world. The Department is also proposing the establishment of more programmes.

In the year 2019 under review, NUC approved the proposed Postgraduate Diploma in Public Health which was designed to also focus on the needs of public health managers at **the service** delivery sector, in order to assist in improving the services offered at the community level. The Department is set to graduate the first set of Post Graduate Diploma Students, and also proposing the initiation of Master in Public Health Programme.

BRIEF ON THE DEPARTMENT

The Bachelor of Medical Laboratory Science (BMLS) programme at Al-Hikmah University Ilorin was established in the year 2018 having realised the need to have qualified hands to serve humanity as scholars and practitioners in the field of Medical Laboratory Science in line with international standards. The commencement of the programme took off after the approval of resource verification by both the National University Commission (NUC) and Medical Laboratory Science Council of Nigeria (MLSCN). The course took off with a total of 56 students comprising 13 students in 200 Level and 43 students at 100 Level of which one of them got transferred to Ambrose Alli University, Ekpoma and another to Crescent University, Abeokuta.

The Department was instituted to produce enough professionals in the field of Medical Laboratory Science to address the challenges of laboratory services and research in health and emerging infectious and non-communicable diseases. BRIEF ON THE DEPARTMENT

The Department of Nursing Science was established by the University in 2019/2020 session and approved to commence intake of students by the National University Commission (NUC). The programme took off with 5 pioneer students at 100 Level in the 2019/2020 academic session with only one academic staff. There is no substantive administrative and supportive staff till date.

In October, 2021, the Nursing Midwifery Council of Nigeria visited the University for advisory and resource verification exercise. The Council expressed satisfaction with the commitment of the University but observed and reported gross shortage of academic staff and enjoined the Management to urgently address the issue.

In pursuance of the global attainment of sustainable development goals and implement action of universal health coverage, the training of highly skilled and competent nurse is vital to diagnosis, treatment and human response to health and illness. The Department of Nursing Science has a vision to produce nursing professionals with specialised knowledge and skills, and with focus on the care of individuals, families and community in order to attain and maintain optimal health and quality life. The Department pursues academic programme guided by the curriculum which has been careful designed and structured to demonstrate knowledge, professional attitudes, skills and civility consistent with global best practices and standard.

In the year under review, Nursing and Midwifery Council of Nigeria (NMCN) conducted advocacy, resource verification and other assessment with a view to preparing the programme for NUC accreditation.

BRIEF ON THE DEPARTMENT

The Islamic Studies programme started in January, 2006 with 30 students, Assistant Lecturers, Lecturer II and Lecturer I. They were able to set the standard of academic excellence from the inception of the Department. Today, the department can boast of 384 students and it is strengthened by the presence of 2 tenured Professors, 3 Senior Lecturers (S/L), 2 Lecturer I (L/I), 2 Lecturer II and 1 Assistant Lecturer (A/L) with 1 secretary and 1 clerical officer. These lecturers are highly experienced are committed to excellence. So far, the department has produced twelve (12) First Class graduates and some of them are already part of the mainstream academic staff of the University while many of them are pursuing postgraduate programmes at different Universities in Nigeria and abroad.

The decision to commence on Master Degree (M.A) as well as the Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D) programmes in Islamic Studies was occasioned by the desire of the graduands from the Department of Islamic Studies to obtain Higher Degrees in the field. In year 2014, the Department got the approval for Postgraduate Programmes in Islamic Studies. So far, the Department has graduated 5 sets of M.A. students with a ray of hope to produce Ph.D. holders very soon.

CHALLENGES AND WAY FORWARD

2020/2021 Academic Session was a special year to the Department of Islamic Studies, of Al-Hikmah University, Ilorin. Full accreditation was obtained by the Department, two of its staff were elevated, one to the post of Senior Lecturer and the other to the rank of Lecturer II. The staff are: Dr S.B. Suraju and Mallam Abdullahi Sayuti Hassan respectively.

However, despite the promotion of some staff, the Department is still suffering from the acute shortage of academic staff to cope with overbearing workload and students' population in the Department at the following levels:

- a. M.A Islamic Studies
- b. M.Phil/Ph.D Islamic Studies

c. Ph.D Islamic StudiesIn the Postgraduate programme, the scale of project supervision which is restricted by 'NUC' to ratio 5:1 poses serious challenges. An extract from 'NUC' guideline is quoted below:

No lecturer should supervise more than 3 Ph.D. Candidates and 2 M.A Candidates at a time.

If we are to go by the existing number of the Postgraduate students alone in the Department which is 93, the scenario poses more challenges to the Department. The Department, therefore, requires more staffing at the middle cadre, i.e, 2 lecturer I with Ph.D to enhance quality assurance and resounding academic output.

Our main library though properly equipped with important references required for Postgraduate Studies stills need more important references in Islamic Studies such as Encyclopaedia of Islamic Studies, Encyclopaedia of Islamic Legal Studies which have been recommended to the Management through the librarian, but unfortunately they are yet to be procured.

SUGGESTION

Sound knowledge of Arabic language should be made a condition for admission to study Islamic Studies at the Undergraduate and Postgraduate levels. This is because Islamic knowledge without sound knowledge of Arabic will only lead to the production of half-baked scholars of the discipline.

BRIEF ON THE DEPARTMENT

In January, 2005, Al-Hikmah University was licensed by the Federal Government of Nigeria. It began academic activities in 2005/2006 session with three colleges, now faculties. The faculties are Faculty of Humanities and Social of Sciences, Faculty of Management Sciences and Faculty of Natural Sciences. Three faculties have been added. They are Faculties of Education, Law and Health Sciences.

Department of Languages came into being in 2005/2006 academic session after the University was licenced by the Federal Government of Nigeria to run undergraduate degree programmes. Two programmes are housed in the Department of Languages: Arabic and English Programmes. In other words, there are two units in the Department: The Arabic and the English Units.

At inception in 2005/2006 academic session, students' population in the Department was six (6), two in the Arabic Unit, four in the English Unit. In 2018/2019 academic session, the students' population in the Arabic Unit rose to 68, English Unit 25. Dr Qaasim Badmassi (now Professor) was the foundation Ag. Head of Department, while Dr Uthman AbdusSalam is the current Ag. Head of Department.

BRIEF ON THE DEPARTMENT

The Department of Political Science and Public Administration was initially named as Department of Political Science and Conflict Resolution. The Department was established during the 2006/2007 academic session with a moderate students' enrolment of 15.

The idea of floating a degree programme in Public Administration, to be domiciled in the Department of Political Science and Public Administration started during the 2017/2018 academic session. As one of the four sub-divisions of the parent-discipline, political science. In 2018, the Nigerian University Commission did resource verification exercise for the programme and the university was authorised to start the programme. By 2018/2019 academic session, the programme admitted four students into 200 Level. In 2020/2021 session, the Department graduated three students along with 42 students graduated in political Science and Conflict Resolution programme. The Department graduated a total number of 45 students in this session. In 2020/2021 academic session, the two programmes: Political Science and Conflict Resolution & Public Administration Programmes conducted NUC accreditation exercise and the programmes earned full accreditation.

The Department was established in 2006/2007 academic session and was named Department of Political Science and Conflict Resolution to award B.Sc. Political Science and Conflict Resolution. The Department was established to produce graduate that will address the issues of bad governance and insecurity that define Third World countries most especially African states. The product of this Department are expected to become high-calibre professionals in the administration of public and private organisation in Nigeria and abroad. The Department which started with just 15 students has graduated over 500 students. In 2017/2018 academic session, the Management of the University was enthusiastic about the idea of degree in Public Administration, since the programme could easily leverage on the existing facilities and resources in the Department of Political Science and Conflict Resolution; hence the idea was approved by the Senate. That development necessitated a change in the nomenclature of the Department to Political Science and Public Administration. Thus, the Department did resource verification by the National University Commission and was authorised to start the programme in 2018/2019 academic session, the first set of student graduated.

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Furthermore, the Department trains and instills in students the capacity for critical thinking and informed perspectives through a broad knowledge of theoretical and practical issues in politics, administration and diplomacy; trains skilled manpower for educational institutions, public bureaucracy, private sector and International Governmental Organisations, and Non-Governmental Organisations (NGOs). The Department implores prospective students in Political Science and Public Administration enroll for either B.Sc. degree in Political Science and Conflict Resolution or Public administration. The Department is blessed with qualified resource personnels with relevant experience.

CHALLENGES AND WAY FORWARD

The Department was confronted with a number of challenges which include the followings:

1. **Inadequate Staff:** The Department is confronted with the challenges of inadequate staff. Presently, the Department has only five (5) academic staff, no secretary and an Office Assistant shared with another Department. Two programmes are domiciled in the Department. The Department, in a session is engaging nothing less than 19 to 20 Parttime and Adjunct lecturers. The Department implores the Management to employ more academic staff and post relevant support staff to the Department.

- 2. Funds: the Department is confronted with inadequate funds. The ways and means given to the Department in a session is not enough to run the Department. At the inception of academic session, the Department usually incurrsdebt before the ways and means is paid. We implore the Management on the prompt release of ways and means and possibly increase it.
- **3. Postgraduate Programmes:** As a result of inadequate academic staff, the Department finds it extremely difficult to float postgraduate programme because the load of work on the two programmes in the Department have over weighed the strength or capacity of the available staff. The Department appeals to the Management to engage more senior academic staff who are capable of handling postgraduate courses. Furthermore the Department is in dire need of support staff most especially, Secretary or Senior Typist.

BRIEF ON THE FACULTY

In line with the National Universities Commission's (NUC) approved Developmental Phases of Al-Hikmah University, and in pursuance of the University's mandate to provide quality and functional tertiary education to the teeming Nigerian populace, the Senate of the University, in her 39th meeting held on Monday,2nd, 2012, approved the establishment of the College of Law (now Faculty of Law). The Senate also mandated the Management to commence infrastructure developments of the proposed Faculty. After the Senate was satisfied with the construction and furnishing of the Faculty building, it further mandated the Management, in her 57th meeting held on Wednesday, 28th May, 2014, to start the process for approval by NUC and the Council of Legal Education (CLE). Consequently, the NUC granted the Faculty approval to commence academic activities. Further, in July, 2015, the Council of Legal Education granted the Faculty the requisite approval. Thus, the Faculty started its programmes in October, 2015.

The National Universities Commission's accreditation team visited the Faculty, from the 3^{rd} to 6^{th} of December, 2017, for accreditation. At the completion of the exercise, the Faculty was granted full accreditation.

The Faculty of Law started its programme in October, 2015, with Prof. Abikan Ibrahim Abdulkadir, as the Pioneer Dean. The Faculty took off with three departments, Department of Islamic Law, with Barr. Onikosi A. A. as its Pioneer head; Department of Private and Business Law, with Prof. Hakeem Ijaya as its Pioneer head; and Department of Public and International Law, with Dr. H.A. Hammed as its Pioneer head.

BRIEF ON THE DEPARTMENT

The Department was established in 2006/2007 academic session to run an undergraduate degree programme in the Faculty of Management Sciences. It got its initial full accreditation in 2008 with a students population of 212 and graduated its first set of students in 2009/2010 academic session with 27 graduands. The students population has increased over the years. It has grown to over 300 students by 2020/2021 academic session. During 2019/2020 academic session, the Department started a postgraduate diploma as well as Master Degree in Accounting.

BRIEF ON THE DEPARTMENT

The Department was created in 2007/2008 with a total number of fourteen (14) students as pioneer students. A year after, the total number of students increased to thirty-eight (38). The Department produced her first set of graduating students totaling 11 in the 2010/2011 academic session.

In the year 2018, because of the enrichment in curriculum, the Department signed an MOU with the Chartered Institute of Bankers of Nigeria (CIBN) for a linkage programme that would qualify graduates from this Department to become chartered by CIBN after writing just five papers out of the numerous qualifying examinations they are expected to write. From the inception, the Department has continued to grow and develop in quality and quantity of human, physical and material resources.

In 2019, the Department was granted approval to commence postgraduate programme leading to the award of Master of Science (M.Sc.) in Finance and Postgraduate Diploma in Finance after the National University Commissions (NUC) resource verification exercise. In the year 2021, the Department was re-awarded full accreditation by the NUC, after undergoing serious screening by the NUC.
