AN ADDRESS DELIVERED BY **DIRECTOR GENERAL FORESTRY RESEARCH INSTITUTE OF NIGERIA ZACHARIA BUBA YADUMA AT AL-HIKMAH UNIVERSITY GREEN CAMPUS INITIATIVE**

All Protocols Observed

I want to thank the management of Al-Hikmah University for inviting me to this green campus flag off program. The initiative is the right step in the right direction considering the trend of environmental issues that have posed the great challenge to human society. It is therefore, important to modify our environmental culture and shift towards creating a sustainable solution. Environmental challenges such as pollution, climate change, global warming, biodiversity loss, depletion of nature's resources, flood, erosion and a host of degradation are ecological problems threatening the continuous survival of human society at local and global level. Hence, there is need to change developmental strategies towards sustainability. Public awareness creation among the present generation will enhance understanding of complex environmental issues and occurrences that contributes to the changes on nature.

The flag off of green campus initiative programme today shows the passion of the university community towards having a safe environment that is undergoing a continuous global change and where everyone has to cope with these changes. It is an action that is geared towards addressing climate change, desertification, drought and creating carbon credit to offset carbon emission. Land use changes associated with deforestation and de-vegetation has resulted to loss of biodiversity as well as disruption of carbon, nitrogen, and other biogeochemical cycles. Human society is suffering when ecosystems are threatened by environmental degradation. The essence of nature to mankind therefore justifies why we need to put together different sustainable environmental based initiative such as green initiative organized by Al-Hikmah University.

It is worthy to note that the green initiative will also offer environmental conservation public outreach to the members of the university community. It will complement national and global conservation effort to save endangered tree species as tree will be allowed to grow to the full natural form for both scientific observation and environmental sustainability satisfaction.
