inaugural lectures and maiden university annual report”.

KU8 HOLDS INTERNATIONAL MAIDEN CONFERENCE

The Universities in Kwara State hold a maiden International Conference at the Main Auditorium of the University of Ilorin on Monday, August 7th, 2023.

One of the speakers at the conference, a Professor of Chemical Engineering at the Federal University of Technology, Minna, Abdulkareem Ambali Saka, explained that grant-writing can be improved through consistent dedication, collaboration and mentoring.

Prof. Saka said this while presenting a paper titled "Grantsmanship: Ethics and Best Practices" at the pre-conference workshop.

The Professor of Chemical Engineering emphasised that the journey to improved grant-writing lies in dedication and cooperation with fellow investigators, willingness to mentor and be mentored as well as the cultivation of a collaborative mindset.

He added that every agency has its distinct formats and interests which scholars must align their proposals with to deliver value for the funding provided.

Prof. Saka noted that though there are challenges in various academic disciplines, scholars in the humanities need not to be discouraged. He urged them to rise to the occasion, saying that despite the competition, there are numerous grants available for those willing to put in the needed efforts. He also advised all researchers to conduct their studies with respect for the rights and dignity of those involved.

According to him "whether researchers are dealing with human subjects or sensitive topics, they should strictly follow the ethical guidelines. Also, potential harm arising from research must be handled with utmost care and caution as safety and well-being of participants must be of paramount concern to the researcher".

Prof. Saka, while explaining the role of mentoring in the realm of grantsmanship, described mentoring as a process of transferring skills, knowledge and strategic insights from mentors to mentees. He, however, said positive attitude towards mentorship opens doors to invaluable connections and networks.

Similarly, the Vice Chancellor, Summit University, Offa, Prof. Abiodun Musa Aibinu, who spoke on the topic "Strategies for Winning Research Grants", revealed that to excel in acquiring grants, researchers need to exhibit proactive behaviours,

meticulous planning, persistent efforts, and persuasive communication skills because grants are not mere handouts but they are awarded to studies that exhibit scientific rigour and promising impactful outcomes.

Prof. Aibinu who was ably represented by the Director, Center for Artificial Intelligence, Kwara State University, Malete (Kwasu), Dr. Abdulwaheed Musa, implore fellow academics not to let their visions become vague by the challenges encountered along the way. He added that studies which require grant support must address a significant problem, with the potentials to advance scientific knowledge and contribute to the expansion or enhancement of existing knowledge while also being feasible to execute and investigate.

In his words, "researcher need requisite skills to win grants, among the skills are crafting compelling grant applications, developing standard operating protocols, creating manuals of procedures that gain approval are all learned abilities and crafting manuscripts that earn publication in peerreviewed journals is also a skill that can be honed through learning and practice.

Prof. Prof. Aibinu emphasised that grantsmanship is a full-time occupation and collaboration is vital to effective grantsmanship. Therefore, he encouraged researchers to collaborate with other researchers in order to leverage on their expertise to address gaps in their own knowledge and training.

Al-Hikmah University in collaboration with Abdulraheem Oladimeji Centre for Entrepreneurial and Vocational Studies (AOCEVS) organised a workshop titled “Training the Trainers on Course-based Entrepreneurship Development” on Wednesday, 26th and Thursday 27th July, 2023 at Hibroch Hotel and Suites, beside Mandate Estate, Ilorin.

The Director of AOCEVS, Prof. Ipoola Okunlola in his address stated that the issue of entrepreneurship development and training has taken a centre stage in Nigeria university education system for obvious reasons.

The Director added that two major issues necessitate the importance of the workshop, which are the limited number of available jobs especially white collar jobs compared to the staggering number of graduates as well as the aggravated insecurity situation all over the country as a direct off-shoot of the situation and meaningful engagement of youths is the panacea to solving the problem. He reiterated that tertiary education curriculum should be aligned with current Nigerian reality.

According to him “Al-Hikmah University has been providing ample opportunities for students to acquire entrepreneurship skill. Some of the skills are pure water bottling, plastic bottle blowing, laptop computer repairs, soap/detergent/cosmetics making, fashion design training, paving stone making, block making, ceiling board making, drone technology, Close Circuit Television (CCTV) security system, graphic design, copy writing amongst others”.

Prof. Okunlola urged the attendees present to see the relevance of these skills

especially on the intended programmes in the Core Curriculum and Minimum Academic Standard (CCMAS) that would be introduced by the NUC in the 2023/2024 academic session.

The Deputy Director of the Centre, Dr. AbdulGaniy Agbaje in his presentation titled “Guidelines on Entrepreneurship Education & Innovation: A New Approach by NUC to Entrepreneurship Education & Innovation”, emphasised the production of wealth seekers, people who only seek white-collar jobs and avoid anything related to blue-collar duties or businesses by the Nigerian University Education. He identified loopholes in the Nigerian Educational System which includes theoretical inclination as most Nigerian universities produce graduates who have little or no employability skills, no entrepreneurship training or any other vocational relevance and this has led to the high unemployment rate especially among university graduates.

In his words “the new focus is now to promote the culture of entrepreneurship and develop competencies; develop entrepreneurial

mindset to enable individuals identify opportunities; organise resources to exploit identified opportunities, identify people's problems, proffer solutions and get paid for it; community engagement and community service; need to diversify the economy by strengthening the Micro, Small and Medium Enterprise (MSMEs) and focus on domestic economy. Consequent upon the positive effects of entrepreneurship as identified by the NUC, Nigerian universities are now being encouraged to advance entrepreneurial thinking and behaviour among students”.

Dr. Agbaje emphasised the NUC support for Nigerian Universities that identify the challenges of their immediate community and proffer solutions to such challenges for certain amount of money which would make them wealth creators.

The Deputy Director advised all lecturers to join the movement of the NUC by changing the mindset of students to be wealth creators and not wealth seekers by instilling the knowledge of entrepreneurship in them.

Mr. Mohammed added that the provision of a safe environment for students, staff and visitors in the University is crucial to the mission and vision of the institution.

According to the Commandant, “there are some key aspects of campus security management, which include: risk assessment, emergency planning, well trained security personnel, access control surveillance and monitoring, crime prevention programme, campus lighting, communication systems, transportation safety, training of staff and students on security procedure, community engagement, incident reporting and analysis, regular review and update of security policies”.

Similarly, the Deputy Commandant NSCDC, Kwara State Command, Mr. Yusuf Ayinde, in his speech reiterated that Al-Hikmah Security personnel should never allow any security agent access to the institution to arrest a staff or

student. He added that such a security agent should write to the management and inform them of the case as it is the management that would hand over such staff or student to the security agent in order to prevent riot or protest in the institution.

Mr. Ayinde added that the university is a microscope of society, as criminal activities can surface in academic environment too. He urged the Al-Hikmah University security personnel to identify and manage criminal related activities in the university.

The Deputy Commandant highlighted some common criminal activities in Nigeria higher institutions, which includes but not limited to: drug abuse and trafficking, assault, driving under influence or driving while intoxicated (DUI/DWI), burglary, theft, fraud, robbery, embezzlement, vandalism, sexual assault, cybercrime,

domestic violence, stalking, kidnapping, homicide, arson, human trafficking, trespassing, disorderly conduct, white-collar crime, etc. He added that proactiveness of security personnel in dealing with criminal activities in the institution could reduce crime rate drastically.

The Registrar, Dr. Kazeem Adebayo Oladimeji, in his remarks urged all Al-Hikmah University security personnel to make use of the training and improve on their duties.

Dr. Oladimeji noted that retraining of security staff of the institution is paramount to the administration as the management would facilitate more of this in order to have a crime free institution for the students. He appreciated the NSCDC for their time and professionalism and also assured them of further collaboration in the nearest future.
